The Township of Centre Wellington intends to proceed with the design and construction of Alternative 3 which will include the replacement of the deck, girders and traffic barriers, modification of the abutments to semi-integral type complete with new waterproofing and paving, road approaches, drainage improvements and utility replacement for Structure 2-F located on St. David Street at Grand River in Fergus. This Alternative will address the advanced state of deterioration and substandard width of the current structure.

As part of this process, a Notice of Completion has been placed in the Wellington Advertiser for the weeks of May 26th and June 3rd, 2017 and the Township of Centre Wellington website – www.centrewellington.ca/environmentalassessment (See Attached).

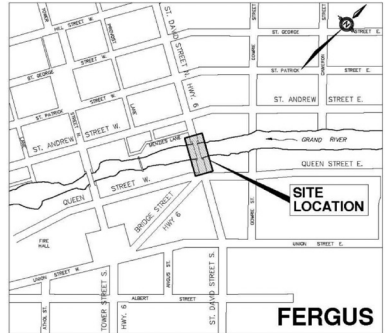

**NOTICE OF COMPLETION
MUNICIPAL CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT
ST. DAVID STREET BRIDGE (STRUCTURE 2-F) REHABILITATION

The Township of Centre Wellington (Township) has conducted a Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study for the rehabilitation of Structure 2-F located on St. David Street (Highway No. 6) crossing over the Grand River in Fergus. This Bridge was constructed in 1968, and is nearing the end of its service life. The Township has evaluated the options and identified the preferred alternative to address the deterioration of the St. David Street Bridge. In April 2016, the Township was successful in securing a \$2.2 million grant for the rehabilitation of the St. David Street Bridge under the Province of Ontario's Connecting Links Program.

The Process: This project is being planned in accordance with the requirements of a Schedule "B" project under the "Municipal Class Environmental Assessment" (Municipal Engineers Association, June 2000 as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015) which is an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. The Class Environmental Assessment process includes public and agency consultation, an evaluation of alternatives, an assessment of potential environmental effects, and identification of reasonable measures to mitigate any adverse impacts that may result.



Preferred Alternative: Subject to comments received as a result of this Notice, and the receipt of the necessary approvals, the Township intends to proceed with the design and construction of Alternative No. 3 which will include the replacement of the deck, girders and traffic barriers, modification of the abutments to semi-integral type complete with new waterproofing and paving, road approaches, drainage improvements and utility replacement.
