Re: Arborist Report Addendum for Fergus Golf Club, Township of Centre Wellington, County of Wellington

Dear Mr. Manoharan:

Beacon Environmental Limited (Beacon) was retained Fergus Development Inc. to prepare an Arborist Report Addendum for the proposed redevelopment of a portion of the Fergus Golf Club, located at 8282 and 8243 Wellington Road 19, Township of Centre Wellington, County of Wellington (hereafter referred to as the "subject property"). The Arborist Report and Tree Inventory and Preservation Plan (TIPP) were completed in April 2023 and revised in December 2023 and submitted as part of a *Planning Act* application to redevelop the subject property. An Arborist Report Addendum was provided in July 2024 as part of an engineering submission for a previously approved development plan.

Fergus Development Inc. intends to develop the subject property for residential use and has received Draft Plan Approval from the Township of Centre Wellington for Draft Plan of Condominium 23CD-22001. Due to market conditions and other considerations, Fergus Development Inc. is proposing a change to the development plan from 118 single lots on a private condominium road to 446 units on municipal right of ways. This Arborist Report Addendum relies on the findings of the previous Arborist Report and addenda submissions and is intended to address changes to the proposed development plan and associated impacts on trees. An updated TIPP is provided herein (**Attachment A**).

Tree Removals

For the previously approved Draft Plan, 333 individually mapped trees and 292 trees within tree grouping A, B, C and E were required to be removed to accommodate development; however, 290 of these trees were dead or dying. An additional 120 dead or dying trees, outside the development plan area were recommended for removal due to condition. The majority of the trees have already been removed from the subject property to facilitate grading and pre-servicing following approval the previous development plan.

While the majority of the trees approved for removal for the previous Draft Plan have been removed, there are three (3) additional trees which require removal based on the revised Draft Plan and associated grading plan. These include Tree Nos. 362, 366 and 367. Therefore, the total number of trees to be removed is 748, with only 338 trees considered healthy, and the remaining 410 dead or dying.

Tree Replacement

It is proposed that only healthy trees (i.e., in fair, fair to good, and good condition) be compensated for at a 2:1 replacement ratio. In this regard, 676 replacement trees will be required. Replacement trees should be planted throughout subdivision, including Open Space blocks. It is our understanding that the County of Wellington will not accept street trees as compensation for tree removals; however, trees in excess of the one tree per lot requirement have been proposed as part of the subdivision landscape plans. Landscape plans will be prepared at detailed design, which will include tree replacement plantings.

Tree Preservation

Twenty-two individual trees and one tree grouping (tree group D) are identified for preservation along the property limits.

There is potential for damage to occur to trees during construction if proper precautions and protection measures are not implemented. Trees can be negatively impacted through grade changes (cutting, filling), soil compaction, root cutting, and mechanical damage to trunks and branches resulting from the operation of construction equipment.

Trees identified for preservation shall be protected by establishing a minimum Tree Preservation Zone (TPZ) based on the tree DBH as indicated in **Table 1**. Tree protection fencing consisting of 1.2 m high page wire fence fitted with filter cloth (silt fence) shall be established as the limit of the TPZ. The location of tree protection fencing is illustrated in **Attachment A**.

Table 1. Minimum Tree Protection Zones

Trunk Diameter (DBH)	Minimum Protection Distances Required
10-29 cm	1.8 m
30-39 cm	2.4 m
40 - 49 cm	3.0 m
50 – 59 cm	3.6 m
60 – 69 cm	4.2 m
70 – 79 cm	4.8
80 – 89 cm	5.4
90 – 100 cm	6

Fencing should be installed before any construction or site alteration takes place.

No grading, soil disturbance, or surface treatments shall occur within the TPZ. No equipment or materials shall be stored inside the TPZ.

The following activities are prohibited within the TPZ:

- Construction;
- Altering of grade by adding fill, excavating, trenching, scraping, dumping or disturbance of any kind;
- Storage of construction materials, equipment, soil, construction waste or debris;
- Disposal of any liquids e.g. concrete sleuth, gas, oil, paint;
- Movement of vehicles, equipment or pedestrians; and

- Parking of vehicles or machinery.

In addition to the establishment of the TPZ, the following measures are recommended to ensure the health and survival of any retained trees:

- Any root damage occurring to retainable trees during construction should be cut cleanly with a handsaw or pruners;
- Any injury caused to a retainable tree during construction should be evaluated by a qualified arborist; and
- Any pruning of trees for construction clearance should be performed by qualified individuals following standard best management practices.
