About the Guelph Humane Society

- Founded in 1893, one of Canada's oldest animal welfare organizations
- Approximately 30 staff, about 20 fulltime and 10 part-time
- Approximately 300 volunteers a year
- Average annual intake: Cats 1000,
 Dogs 500, Small Animals 100,
 Wildlife 1250
- Provide animal control services to Guelph, Centre Wellington and Guelph-Eramosa, full humane society and investigations services throughout Wellington County (except Erin)
- In addition to animal care, offer education initiatives, shelter visits, fostering, advocacy, etc.




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Field Services

- Field response for stray domestic animals
- Field response to sick, injured, and orphaned wildlife
- Public education on by-law requirements
- Investigations, enforcement, and prosecution of all municipal animal control by-laws
 - Ex. Dog-at-large, kennel, licensing
- Annual kennel inspections
- Pick-up and disposal of deceased companion animals on public property



Field Services - continued

- Investigation of provincial legislation Dog Owner's Liability Act (DOLA)
- Participate in rabies surveillance program
- Emergency services 24 hours a day, 7 days per week
 - animals in a life-threatening animal emergency
 - animals posing an immediate risk to public safety
 - as requested by the Police, public health, or any other government provider regarding the safety of animal/member of the public.



Pound Services

- Animal care facility for housing of stray animals during impoundment period
- Facilitate reclaim of stray animals by owners through:
 - Social Media
 - Database of lost reports
- For stray animals that are unclaimed, we provide necessary veterinary care and move them into adoption stream to find new homes
- For wildlife, transfer to licensed wildlife rehabilitation centres for care, treatment, and eventual release



Changes to Contract Fee

- 1. No adjustment to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) to the annual contract fees since commencement of contract (July 2016).
- 2. Ontario's Fair Workplaces, Better Jobs Act, 2017 (Bill 148) impacted salary costs at GHS, due primarily to the minimum wage increases (2018), and associated salary scale adjustments and wage compression.
- 3. At onset of contract, field response and sheltering services was estimated at 8% of GHS' operations. Actual data available is now known to be 13%.
