### **HERITAGE**

#### WHAT WE DO

Heritage Planning staff are responsible for:

- Reviewing heritage permit applications for designated properties
- Reviewing requests to demolish heritage structures (full or partial)
- Maintaining the Municipal Register and making recommendations to add/remove properties
- Reviewing Heritage Impact Assessments for development applications
- Acting as liaison to Heritage Centre Wellington to provide advice, information and direction
- Maintaining heritage information on the website, including Heritage Register information and mapping
- Managing Township heritage projects, such as the CHL Study and Inventory

- The Township of Centre Wellington currently has 1053 properties on the Municipal Register
  - 119 designated
  - 934 listed

What is the status of my heritage property?

Contact the Township's heritage planning staff or visit the Township website heritage page (see "Heritage Register" under the "Heritage" page in "Explore CW").

How do I apply to demolish a structure on my heritage property?

Provide a notice to the Township's heritage planning staff or visit the Township website "Heritage" page (located under "Explore CW") and see "Heritage Property Information".

Can I make alterations to my heritage property?

This depends on the status of a heritage property, whether designated or listed (see "Heritage Property Information" on the Township website).

How do I get my property designated/undesignated?

Contact the Township's heritage planning staff directly to discuss this process.

Is there funding available to assist in maintaining/restoring my heritage property?

Not at this time, but staff is exploring a future grant program.
